The Gift

For many years, I have wanted to take a great photo of a male cardinal bird, preferably in the snow. I love the contrast between the vivid red color and the white winter landscape. But, when the universe provides an opportunity, regardless of season, one graciously accepts the gift!

It was late afternoon on a lovely autumn day in Nov. 2012. I had just finished visiting with Sister Julia in the main house and was returning to hermitage "Paul". As I walked along the wooded path toward "Paul," I noticed a vivid red color in the grass several feet from the "Paul" sidewalk. I paused, correctly assuming it was a cardinal and, being a typical bird, expected it to fly away as I drew near. It didn't!

I stood for quite a while before taking another step. When I did, the bird didn't move. I took another step, no movement. As I inched closer, I saw the Cardinal's eyes were open and his head turn slightly. Yet I wondered, "Why isn't he flying away?" It began to feel like this was no ordinary event. It seemed like time was standing still.

Eventually, I very slowly and deliberately made my way inside "Paul" to get my camera, a 34 year old Canon AE1. I haven't gotten around to purchasing a digital camera with a zoom lens yet, so I used the 50 MM lens that was attached at that moment. I knew I wouldn't have time or the opportunity to change lenses once I started snapping. I gently opened the porch door and sat in the chair next to the porch side window. The bird remained unmoved since I first saw it about 10 or 15 minutes ago. I talked to him, asking if he was injured and sent him love. He looked at me as if to say, "I'm fine.

Take the picture already!" So, again, very slowly, I stood up and walked even closer, then sat down in the grass, not 2 feet from him! I kept thinking "This is amazing. I have NEVER seen this kind of bird behavior before!" Based on some of my past experiences with animals and birds, I knew that the sound of the shutter makes them fly/run away. I had to make sure my one chance for this photo had better be good! I took a long time to focus and frame the shot. Then I snapped it. To my continuing amazement, the bird didn't move! Didn't even flinch! I was able to take 4 more photos. Then I was ready to take one more and when I did, the bird flew away into the thicket behind the bird feeder, apparently perfectly fine.

This entire event felt like an otherworldly experience. It is like I left this reality and walked into an answer to a deep-seated desire....a photo of a cardinal at close range, although not on a snowy landscape as was my preference. This was indeed a gift, one of many that CITW bestows upon retreatants while in solitude. May you all be "GIFTED" with your hearts' desire!

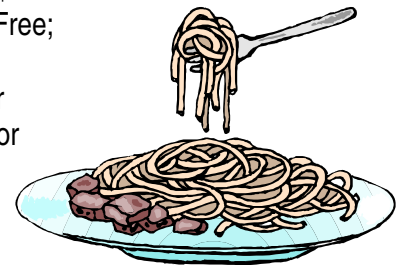
